


WEAVING WITH A SHEEP

What do sheep do all year round? Where does wool come from?



HOW TO WEAVE?

These are all the elements you need to learn weaving. Roll a piece of wool around the shuttle and let's start.












BASIC WEAVE






1 BAND IT AROUND


Wrap the elastic band around the sheep's belly and then attach the beaded loops to the sheep's legs.





2 INTERWEAVE


Wind the shuttle with the wool through every second vertical thread. Zigzag with it going over one thread and under the next one until you finish one side of the sheep.



(3) SWEATER UP!

Once you've got one side ready weave the wool on the other side to complete the sheep's shearling. Once it is done you just break the thread. You don't need knots.






A KEEP IN MIND

Each time you finish one row, unroll enough wool from the shuttle to do the next one.




FURRY WEAVE




1) PREPARE THE WOOL

Make short straps of wool, they can be 10 cm long. You can use scissors or just break it with your hands.




(3) BASIC STITCH

After weaving a 'furry' row weave three basic ones. Repeat these steps until you finish one side to the top and do the other with the same method.



(2) TIGTHEN THE WOOL

Weave three rows of thread with basic weave. Then tighten 3 straps as shown, tangling them over 2 vertical threads and push its endings to the front. Once again no knot is needed.



BE CRAFTY!

You can practice these weavings or come up with different ones by cutting off the wool as shown and weave any kind of thread you have at home. Be crafty and explore possibilities to dress this sheep up.
